Beginning this winter we will bring our membership an annual print issue of our newly expanded newsletter, followed by quarterly online publications which will keep you up to date with information about current news and events at the Museum. This will also enable us to provide a larger variety of articles featuring Leelanau history throughout the year. There have been many things happening at the Leelanau Historical Society and Museum since our last newsletter. Laura's extensive knowledge and expertise on this subject is sure to add a new dimension to the unique collection of black ask baskets and quill boxes housed at the Leelanau Historical Society.

Our collaboration with area schools reached a high note this year as Leelanau Schools reached out to LHS to assist with the Winter Term "Leelanau Revealed", a study where students explored the history and people of the Leelanau peninsula. Students had the opportunity to research while exploring evidence of the area's past through written and photographic materials in the LHS archives.

In conclusion, we hope you enjoy this issue of LeeMuse and we look forward to seeing you at the Museum to join us for upcoming programs and events!



Mr. Mrs. BRAMMER

Matilda C. Tesch (B. 17 Feb 1857, D. 10 Feb 1947) & Frank F. Brammer (B. 28 Jan 1851, D. 22 Mar 1923) married in 1880 in Germany. In 1882 they immigrated to America with their infant daughter. Frank, having previous been employed in the gristmill industry began working at a gristmill in Glen Arbor, MI. The millpond was originally built on the banks of the Crystal River north of Glen Arbor, MI by John Fisher around 1859 to accommodate a gristmill and sawmill. The mill was under Thomas Kelderhouse's ownership when Mr. & Mrs. Brammer moved to Glen Arbor. In 1897, Matilda and Frank took possession of the gristmill & surrounding 78 acres.

They moved into the house that sits adjacent to the mill with their Family. The Brammers had a total of 10 children; Hattie, Louisa, Bertha, Martin, Bernhardt, August, Frank, Herman, Amil, & Rose (died in infancy).

In 1906, Frank renovated the gristmill by updating the original millstones with roller mills, a new and more efficient technology.

"Farmers came from all over to have their wheat ground for bread flour. Often a group of farmers got together and brought in about fifty bushels of grain at a time. It took about eight hours to grind that much grain...I think my dad used to sell flour for about \$3.50 a barrel."

- Interview with Herman Brammer, 1975.

Herman took over the mill operations after Frank's death. August later returned to the area to take his turn at running the mill. Commercial grains increased in popularity and thus the demand for locally grown/ground grain faded. Mrs. Brammer had passed away and it came time for the family to close the mill. It sat quiet for 17 years boarded up with flour still resting in barrels and sieves. It was sold out of the Brammer family in 1964. It saw other uses over the years; including a recording studio owned by Fred Ball. Under his ownership the site was recognized as a Michigan State Historic Site on November 7, 1977.

Mrs. Brammer's dress may have faded; the mill weathered from exposure, but each has withstood the test of time to continue telling the story of one Leelanau County family.

DIGITIZATION: /,dijede'zaSH(e)n/

NOUN:

The process of converting text, pictures, or sound into a digital format that is utilized by a computer.

If you have visited the museum or looked at any of our publications you may have noticed we use the word "Digitization" a lot (maybe too much)!

But what is "Digitization"?
Put simply we can define it as:
the conversion of text and pictures into a digital format that
can be accessed from a computer.

So how do we do that? We are using a museum software called PastPerfect. Each artifact, archival item, and photograph is entered into this database with a description, storage location, physical condition, search terms, and in most cases a photograph. We have various scanners, cameras, and recording devices we use to capture the digital version of the archival item. This is all in an effort to make the history of Leelanau more accessible and easily shared. Sometimes we encounter items that we do not have the skill or equipment to digitize in house.

One example is our newspaper collection. The large format and fragility of the papers make it difficult for us to digitize but thankfully we have an exceptional resource in Central Michigan University's Clarke Historical Library. As you read this newsletter, about 50 years worth of early Leelanau County newspapers are being digitized at CMU. First the microfilm is scanned, the images are optimized, then special text scanning software is used to make the newspapers keyword searchable. It's a lengthy process but we expect the newspapers to be online this year.

We will update you as soon as we have a better idea of the exact date. The newspaper digitization project would not be possible without the many supporters who voted for us during the grant process or who stepped forward with a financial gift after we placed third in the grant competition. Special thanks to Board Member, Hayward Draper, who's matching gift accelerated the fundraising for the newspaper digitization.

HISTORY SPEAKERS



LOOKING FORWARD IN 2018

As another year begins, we have been working on a fun line-up of speakers, events, and fundraisers. A complete calendar of events will be available on our website in May.



- In Memory of Katherine Hall Wheeler, benefactor of the Traditional Anishinabek Arts Room, a new interpretive project is being curated by Laura Quakenbush.
- LHS will host the Northern Michigan Alliance of the Historical Society of Michigan on April 17th. The day long meeting for history professionals will include a presentation and a workshop for archival photograph care & management.
- •Leelanau Peninsula History Network is working on a folding travel map identifying locations of the sixteen member organizations and additional heritage tourism sites. "Experience Historic Leelanau," coming summer 2018.
- In collaboration with local historian and author, Kathy Firestone, a History Writers Group held its inaugural meeting in October and plans to schedule regular gatherings and workshops.

LEARNING TO LOVE HISTORY

Over the last year LHS has been actively seeking to work with area schools to expand our educational outreach. Some of our recent projects include...

• Dr. Ted Ligibel's students in Eastern Michigan University Historic Preservation Program will be aiding the Leelanau Peninsula History Network in story mapping, a feature of ArcGIS, historic sites for inclusion in an online Leelanau history touring guide.

• The Leelanau School's history class is working with LHS, learning about Leelanau County history by delving into the archives and looking at primary source documents and photos.

• Education intern, Ben Bearre, gave presentations on life in the 1880's to a number of third grade field trip groups last fall.

• Leland Public School art students visit LHS annually to select historic photos to use for various art projects. Some students create past/present juxtapositions with various mediums, using the photo as reference. Their creativity is the limit.
